One of the ways in which I feel inspired to write is by taking my favorite quotes and expanding on their message, the way that I experience and understand the message. The project has developed into a kind of oracle card experience for me, seeing them as a message, intention, or practice for the day. When Heide asked me to share some writing for the month, I thought I would share some of this project with you. Perhaps you'd like to read one for each day, or each week, and let it become a spiritual practice for you. I hope you enjoy!

"Let yourself be silently drawn by the strange pull of what you really love. It will not lead you astray." -Rumi

What is it that makes your heart flutter? When do you feel the spark in your soul? Do you listen to it when you feel it, do you breathe into it and let it grow until it's loud enough for you to follow, each day and each moment? Or do you shy away for fear of where it might lead? These flutters and sparks are the ways our souls speak to us. They are messages from our inner guidance and they are trying to call us into being. We might be afraid to listen, for fear that the message will tell us that we have big changes to make. There might be a sense that this

spark is threatening or destructive to the life we have built up to this point. Sometimes this is true. Lauren Tatarsky Sometimes when we listen to the strange pull of what we really love, it requires us to leave old patterns, relationships, and structures. And sometimes it just allows us to deepen and enrich our lives in this moment. It is up to you to trust this strange pull, to listen to the flutter in your heart. Rumi's message is true, it will not lead you astray. Follow it. Let it be your guide. Trust that it will take you exactly where you are meant to go.

It is the art of repairing broken items by fusing them together with gold. The lesson of kintsugi is that in our brokenness, we become even more valuable. Our imperfections and challenges are part of our story, part of our souls, and part of who we are. Being vulnerable and allowing our cracks to be visible actually brings more light into our lives. With our cracks, we are far wiser and far more real and this is what we all crave, to be real with one another. You are allowed to be imperfect. In fact, you absolutely must be imperfect because you absolutely must be human. You are allowed to make mistakes, even big ones. You are allowed say the wrong thing and do the wrong thing. We are not here to get it all right. We are here to show up in

all our beauty and all our mess. Hold yourself lightly and give yourself a lot of room for the gold to fill in, for the light to get in.

"Let your grief be as full of joy as it is of sorrow. Let it be proof of how much you loved, how deeply you've allowed life to live in you, how wide the river of your heart has become. Instead of turning away from love so as not to invite loss, love fully, and learn to grieve." -Elizabeth Lesser Love and loss are two sides of the same coin. When we chose to love, we chose to risk our hearts. It is not an easy choice. The fear of loss runs deep, especially when we've known the pain of loss in our past. But a life without love loses its meaning, so we tenderly guide ourselves back towards love, instead of turning away. It is through deep grief that we can crawl our way out, stitch up our broken hearts, and open up to love again. Deep grief is a heart-opening emotion. It will clear the path. There is never a time where we forget the loss of someone we loved, so it is okay to grieve often throughout your life. Make space for your grief. Allow it to rise up in you and move through you whenever it shows up. Make it a spiritual practice. Light candles, wrap yourself in blankets, and let vourself weep until there are no tears left. And from that tenderhearted place, let yourself open to new love. There is room in your heart for love, grief, and more love. Don't turn yourself away.

This month we honor Mary Alice Truitt. Mary Alice is enthusiastic in her pursuit of spiritual integrity. She lives strongly in faith one day at a time. Mary Alice spent her early years in her Grandparent's home in Saline. There, she was exposed to a plethora of esoteric theories, mystical experiences, and metaphysical literature. Her concept of the Divine is that it exists everywhere and in everything. Mary Alice believes there are many ways to look at faith and spiritual practices; everyone has a way and a path that brings them to the Divine, they may now just be waking up to this possibility.

The Monday night ACIM study group is what brought her to the Center five years ago. She says she is beyond grateful to have found a space where she could remember how to be open to the multitude of interpretations of Divine experience. Mary Alice has a Master's degree in Public Policy as well as many years of experience working with nonprofit organizations. She says she "wants to help people who want to help people. There are many ways to do this, including just being present." She used to think this meant raising funds for organizations that provide emotionally intense services; but she has learned from the Center that help comes in many forms. Mary Alice still visits her grandparents every week for dinner and mystical, metaphysical discussions. We are so blessed to have Mary Alice with us to help create with us our future as a spiritual center.
