This spring has brought transitions into our community like a whirlwind of air on a spring day. It ushered in change that will soon bring about flowers of life, songs of spirituality, and community growth. On April 1st 2018, the Interfaith Center for Spiritual Growth senior minister unexpectedly departed from our community. Following a grieving and regrouping period of two weeks the ICSG Board hosted a weekend of peace circles at ICSG. Two talented and trained mediators guided community members in attendance to speak earnestly and openly about their human experiences, hopes, and dreams for the ICSG community.

Our community spoke of the trust they invested in creating a space of emotional safety over the previous ten months. They spoke of the painful challenge of the previous three weeks of seeking the opportunity in disguise for ICSG to become more than it had been before.

The idea for the community convening developed on April 3rd. Comfort and clarity became priorities for the board when the pleasant and jovial norms of Sunday Service announcements were broken on the second and third Sundays.

Synchronistically Khristian Speelman and Layla Ananda – professional conflict resolution facilitators – reached out separately to offer their skills of holding safe space for our community to share the experience of participatory healing. Layla created an altar of rose quartz and a single candle in the center of the circles. Khristian opened the first circle with a prayer for open heartedness, intentional presence allowing healing and moving forward.

Our wireless microphone became our spiritual talking stick. Each person had the mic for three minutes to explain what they were processing, what was most important moving forward, and what they need or want to offer for our community to heal. Between the forty humans on Saturday and the sixty humans on Sunday exquisite care and respect for the integrity of ICSG became apparent. Two specific themes stood out: our spiritual family and home and spiritual activism.

Spiritual Family and Spiritual Home is a feeling of the power of the collective and the individual. It includes everyone's point of view where we learn and grow together while sharing spiritual presence. It is a feeling of full hearts no matter how things go in the outside world. It is a mirror of the divinity within each of us. It holds space for studies, celebrations, spiritual experiences, and fellowship.

Spiritual Activism at ICSG needs continued support and acknowledgment. Activism takes many forms and looks different for each person. We are called to activism. We are challenged to surrender unto Love by all of our exchanges with one another. Being present in this community is a tremendously profound

amount of work. The world needs more love and at ICSG we are able to expand our ability to be more loving. Internal activism is healing our own inner pollution by asking ourselves such questions as what is my opportunity for change today? We hope to inspire and draw many more people with energy to do what it takes to heal this world. To walk in the mystery, extending Love to All That Is, and having faith that we are not alone in this world.

Thank you Khristian Speelman and Layla Ananda for creating the peace circles with intention of engaging our spiritual community.

# Newsletter Frequency and other Communications:

The Inspirer is the ICSG newsletter. It reflects who we are and shows people outside of ICSG that we are a community of actively engaged spiritual seekers. The newsletter is printed, put into welcome packets, and is available online. It contains inspirational items, Board minutes, a calendar of activities, Community Member of the month, etc. Heide has been putting the Inspirer together for many years and volunteers her time to do so. When Heide asks for submissions and it would be helpful if community members would submit items to be published. How can we encourage and inspire members to contribute? Community members are encouraged to write and share any articles on spiritual topics, short blogs, favorite songs, poems, quotes, etc. The Communication team will look at if once a month is too frequent and if not, how best to get the information needed for the newsletter so that we can get it out at the beginning of each month.

The Inspirer will always be the inspirational document that represents the center. We still need someone to help with the Community Member of the Month article. Is this too big a job for one person to do on a monthly basis? Perhaps regular monthly items and big updates on a quarterly basis? It might be helpful to have 2 people alternate months. This is important as a way to acknowledge community members and to show that ICSG relies on and appreciates their volunteers.

The Board has identified a need for an official Communication team to coordinate all the formats and avenues used to inform our membership and visitors about our spiritual center, events, and classes. A need to be addressed is how to ensure that information about the internal functions is available to the community membership in a timely and easy-to-access manner.

The Communication team and the board will explore the most efficient way for Board communication to get out to the community. Currently using the website and mailchimp/online newsletter.

# 50 Children, Social Justice and Spiritual Activism

Discussion about the 50 children that have been sent to Michigan after being separated from their parents at the southern border. Discussion focused on what we could do as a congregation and if we should get involved; prayer circles, participation in demonstrations, collection of relief donations. One of ICSG's guiding principles is that individuals are encouraged to think, say, and do whatever they want. Organizing for spiritual action and social justice is something that many QCC attendees want to participate in. A Social Justice committee will form to explore ways that the ICSG community can help; This committee will also include the coordination work of the Washtenaw Sanctuary Congregation partnership with Interfaith Council for Peace and Justice, as well as the Uncomfortable Conversations on Race.

#### **Board Updates**

Becky Rowe has resigned from both, the ICSG Board and as the ICSG Web Administrator. She's done a tremendous job in both realms and we will miss her. The Board is currently evaluating what skills and talents are needed for a new board member. When a board member leaves mid-term, the vacancy is filled by discernment of current Board members. This has been the process since the center opened. When a Board member completes their two-year commitment, the vacancy is voted on by general membership at the respective annual meeting. Becky had filled a vacant board seat midterm, and so the new member chosen will finish the term of that seat as of March of 2019. Layla Ananda will fill the vacancy of Web Administrator.

The Board is in the process of finishing a Conflict and Grievance policy, Safe Church policy, and Whistleblower policy. The Board is working to secure pro bono legal assistance so to verify legality of each policy.

The Finance team is updating their charter to acknowledge the internal controls utilized in the first three days of April following the unexpected resignation of the former senior minister. Updated treasurer job description reflects the interim oversight needed in the absence of Senior Minister/ CEO. Both policies expected to be voted on at July Board meeting.

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#### **Ministerial Transition:**

Delyth and Annie have both picked up additional responsibilities. They are both receiving compensation for this although it's not much for everything we are with guest speakers and associate ministers? that they are doing. They have a contract to be reviewed for renewal every three months, so that their pay and responsibilities can be evaluated on a regular basis to ensure fair compensation.

Both Annie and Delyth will be available for spiritual guidance. Dave Bell has said that he's be available as needed.

#### **CoCreation Team**

Several Board members are active on the Co-Creation team. New members joined in May to help guide the community of ICSG through this ministerial transition and continue with the visioning and planning of our future as a spiritual center. This work will also allow the ministers to stay focused on engagement of spiritual seekers and allow the board to stay focused on policy and current needs of the center as a whole.

#### THE SLUGS OF SUMMER

A year ago I wrote about ticks; I wanted to bring some balance to the media hysteria about how evil ticks are. Today I'm writing about another creature who is very unpopular this time of year, especially with gardeners! And I'd like to start out by telling you that I'm quite fond of slugs and snails and similar animals that many people never really think about. I like their energy and cheerful nature, and their cute little faces. I've even kept them as "pets". All this background info will make sense as you continue to read.

My apartment complex was built in a strip of forest on the edge of Ford Lake. As a result we have a LOT of wild-life living here and passing through, which is usually a wonderful thing. This is my third summer here and I'm growing marigolds for the first time. Problem is, it turns out that slugs REALLY love marigolds and the poor plants are being stripped, from the ground up. I would have thought a spicy plant like that would be immune to slime-trailing snackers, but that's not so.

A brief conversation with a slug representative was unproductive: I got a flat NOPE when I asked about a truce or a compromise. (I'm sure it would have helped if I had waited until dark to connect, instead of trying to negotiate during the day when the slugs are sleeping!)

Meanwhile, my Sage plants were also getting chewed on, and I asked what I could do to help. To my surprise, the answer was: "Nothing. We can handle this." That evening, my Sage plant had more to say:

"I do not mind a nibble here or a nibble there. Sometimes the slugs come to us for healing substances we can provide. Only the weak and sick plants are harmed by slug dining.

"Yes, marigolds are medicinal for the slugs. There is so much poison used here and it makes the slugs sick. [Referring to insecticides.] The marigold essence helps them.

"Yes they do LIKE the taste of marigolds [aside from illness]; that is part of the scenario. They are not mindless, they have awareness of the consequences of their actions; as in, if they eat every bit of a plant it might not grow anymore and they must seek elsewhere.




